


% of PP pupils achieving 5+ level 1 qualifications




% of PP pupils achieving 5+ qualifications including Eng and Maths




English levels of progress

Pupils wider understanding of the outside world is developed. Pupils attend trips- at least 1 trip per group per year.	£200	Educational trips identified for pupils including curriculum visits and sporting activities.	All year groups have attended at least 1 trip out per half term. All pupils have engaged with trips to a variety of different places in and around the Mansfield area.	
Pupils make appropriate learning gains and are on track to achieve targets.	£23690	Adult/TA support within lessons (Money split across 8 members of staff to target disadvantaged pupils in lessons in all year groups).
